## **you have the right. . .**

to need time, help, information, and so on.

to ask for time and help.

to get time and help from peers, teachers, administrators, staff, and so on.

to take time to make a decision.

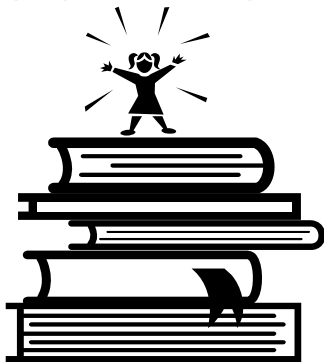
to ask questions about process, teachers, administrators, and so on.

to ask others to keep agreements (faculty, administrators, staff, peers).

to ask for fair evaluations and feedback.

to ask for reconsideration of grades, dates, and so on.

to ask people to take responsibility for their actions.



to make mistakes AND to be responsible for them.

to make requests that are sanctioned by rules.

to make requests for change in others' behavior.

to refuse requests for personal information.

to refuse a request without feeling guilty.

## **you have the right. . .**

to express your own opinion and preference about what is valuable to you as a learning experience.

to express your feelings -- positive and negative, including disappointments, frustrations, etc.

to define your motives and behavior.

to present yourself positively.

to set your own priorities, agendas, etc.

to control your own work, ideas, and so on and to determine how you will spend your time.

to apply your own judgment to making decisions about yourself and your future.

to negotiate differences or conflicts.

to be treated with respect, to be listened to, and to be taken seriously.
